Key Definitions

Abrahamic Religions: Religions whose followers believe in prophet Abraham and his descendants to hold an important role in human spiritual development. The best known Abrahamic religions are Judaism, Christianity and Islam. True Abrahamic religions are monotheistic. They also all believe that people should pray to and worship God often. Of monotheistic religions, the Abrahamic religions have the world's largest number of followers. They are also all ethical monotheistic religions meaning they have a certain set of rules that they have to follow.

Religious Tolerance: When people allow others to think or practice other religions and beliefs without judgment or harassment (such as vandalism or physically attacking people of different religions/beliefs). In a country with a state religion, *toleration* means that the government allows other religions to be there.
